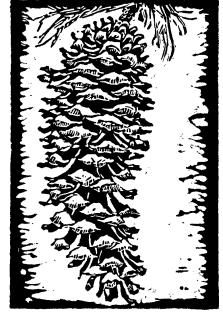


Christmas 2011
