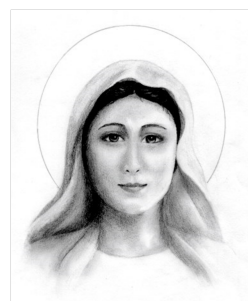
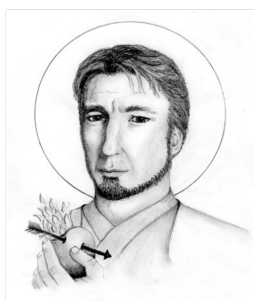

Sacraments

Baptisms:

- ✞ If you call the office after business hours, the recording will give you the number to call for an **emergency anointing only**.
- ✞ An individual may receive one anointing per month.

Gospel Meditation

The beatitudes of Jesus are a kind of self-portrait. But it is a strange picture. At first, the blessings of being poor, mourning, and hungering and thirsting for righteousness may seem bizarre or, worse, a religious delusion. Who wants to look like *that*? But if we look again, we begin to see the characteristics of Jesus' form. He becomes poor and fills it with his riches for us, he weeps and mourns for us, and fills it with his joy, he hungers and thirsts for us to be righteous, and so satisfies us. And so on. It's the way he appears on the cross.

Perhaps we should put on our bedroom room walls the words of the beatitudes next to a crucifix of the Lord Jesus. Then we can do what the beatitudes are designed for, to gaze at the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength of the one who is our origin, and who is with us every day. And little by little, we'll start to look like him.

Administrative Assistant

St. Augustine Church is seeking to hire a full-time (30 hours per week) Administrative Assistant to support the Pastor and Parish Administrator. The overall duties include overseeing and managing all routine office activities, maintaining the parish database of information, the collections system, registering new parishioners, working with volunteers, developing the weekly bulletin and coordinating parish mailings. Candidate must be fluent in English, have thorough knowledge of MS Office and strong computer skills. Necessary skills include strong verbal and written communication, attention to detail, organizational abilities, ability to multitask, administration experience and some accounting experience. Accompanist (piano/organ)

St. Augustine Church and St. Mary Churches are seeking to hire an accompanist (piano and/or organ) to provide music for parish liturgies and other designated celebrations.
