#### The Priesthood and the Eucharist

"These two Sacraments were born together," wrote St. John Paul II of the priesthood and the Eucharist, "and their destiny is indissolubly linked until the end of the world." Now He comes as the very means by which we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the most familiar and comforting thing in the world to us. How generous of Him to allow these human creations — who share in our own faults — to be the means through which He comes to us in the Eucharist. Without the Eucharist, we would have no eternal life. Without priests, we would have no Eucharist.
