

# October is Respect Life Month

Every October, the Church in the U.S. celebrates
Respect Life Month. We reflect on the gift of every human
life and how to build a culture that protects life
from conception to natural death.

#### Question:

Can a person (the mother, father, or provider) ever be forgiven for an abortion?

#### Answer:

For people of faith, any conversation of human sinfulness should always lead us to reflect on God's loving mercy. Because God's mercy is greater than any sin, the Church is clear that even those involved in the sin of abortion can be reconciled with God and the Church. To make this grace more available through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Pope Francis extended the permission to absolve someone of the sin of abortion to all priests in 2016. Even with the grace and blessings of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the tragedy of abortion and the aftermath of abortion takes a toll on

everyone involved. Ministries of outreach and support, like Project Rachel, offer pastoral counseling, support groups, retreats, and other forms of care.
