

- Spend time volunteering at church or other charitable organization
- Donate a dozen pieces of your clothing, your "extra" coat, or a pair or two of shoes
- **Solution** Use a portion of your grocery budget to buy items for the food bank
- Donate toiletries, feminine supplies, new socks, or underwear to a shelter
- Prepare lunches and coffee at home. Donate what you might have spent on fast food, etc.
- Make a meal and deliver it to an elderly neighbor or friend in need of a break


